Music: Tuesday

In Music this term, the students in grades 5 6 will be introduced to the composer Edvard Grieg, the song called "In the Hall of the Mountain King" and the story of Peer Gynt, which Edvard Grieg composed music for. During this unit of work, they will be learning about the geography and fables / stories from Norway (where he was born) and how these influenced his work as well as analysing, composing and performing a small melody using the musical idea from the song.

Art: Thursday

During Term 1 for Applefest, we will be looking at the theme of the 'apple tree in summer' through the medium of photography. Students will use a range of photographic tools including rule of thirds, close up, landscape/portrait composition and editing. We will also create a gridded up pencil portrait of a famous person using various shading techniques.

- Reading and recording home reading nights four times a week logging reading using "Do it" diary.
